

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), for children whose parents are in the forces and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months.

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However, we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils. From September 2012, we are required to publish online information about how we have used this premium. This ensures that parents, carers and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the premium and the extra support that they receive.

IMPACT 2015 /16

In our Foundation Stage classes 95% of our children achieved a Good Level of Development in Reading, 86% in Writing and 87% in Number. There are 4 pupil premium children 1 achieved Good Levels of Development in Reading, Writing and Maths when assessment were submitted. One child achieved GLD by the end of the academic year. Two pupil premium children did not achieve in line with their peers although progress was good.

The children who were involved in Boxhall all improved socially and emotionally and their Good Levels of Development across Making Relationships, Reading, Writing and Number confirm this including all our pupil premium children.

In Year 1 there are 7 pupil premium children and 6 achieved Age Related Expectations (ARE) in Reading, 4 achieved in Writing and 6 in Maths.

86% of Year 1 children passed the Phonics test including 6 of our pupil premium children who were entered.

In Year 2 there are 15 pupil premium children and 13 achieve ARE in Reading, 10 achieved in Writing and 12 in Maths. Two pupil premium children have Educational, Helathcare Plans (EHCP). All made more than expected progress from their starting points.

100% achieved the retaking of the Phonics screening.

Our Speech and Language team have worked with children across the school and as a result the number of children on programmes has reduced.

Sports Coaches have taken children before school to improve their gross motor control, encourage them to work as a team and build on their games skills.
